SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM 2015

Scarborough Community Services Summer Day Camp is participating in the Summer Food Service Program.

Meals will be provided free to all eligible children. To be eligible to receive free meals at camp, children must meet the income guidelines for reduced price meals in the National School Lunch Program. The income guidelines for reduced price meals are listed below.

Children who are part of households that receive Food Stamps or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) are automatically eligible to receive free meals.

Acceptance and participation requirements for the program and all activities are the same for all regardless of race, color, national origin, gender, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided at the sites and times as follows:

Lunch: 12:00 - 12:30 PM

Snack: 3:00 - 3:30 PM

Or you may mail completed applications along with registration to Brenda Franklin of the Scarborough School Nutrition Program.
